ORDER &C.

A duly signed petition, praying that a special elec-  
tion be held at some convenient place within the territorial  
limits hereinafter described, in conformity with the provis-  
ions of an act of the Legislature of the State of New Jersey  
entitled "An Act for the formation of Borough Governments"  
approved April 5th, 1878, and the supplements thereto, to the  
end that the legal voters within said territorial limits may  
vote for or against the formation of a proposed Borough to be  
known as "The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale"  
having been presented to me, in which petition the proposed  
Borough is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the southeast corner hereof in the  
southerly line of lands of Alfred Ackerman and in the middle  
of a small brook known as smokis voll brook and running from  
thence (1) North 69 degrees 45 minutes West 21 chains and 70  
links to the middle of the public road leading to Whites paper  
mill, (2) North 19 degrees East through the middle of the  
same 5 chains and 62 links, (3) North 85 degrees West 3  
chains and 17 links, (4) North 19 degrees East 3 chains and  
35 links, (5) along lands of Hopper & White North 85 degrees

West 23 chains and 92 links to the middle of the Hohokus  
brook, (6) Northwesterly through the middle of Hohokus brook  
11 chains to the mouth of a small brook on the South side of  
Hohokus brook, (7) along said small brook Northwesterly 21  
chains and 72 links to the middle of a bridge over said brook  
and in the center of a lane leading over lands of John A.  
Storms, (8) South 63 degrees 30 minutes West 18 chains and 88  
links to lands of John Van Blarcom, (9) along the East line  
of said Van Blarcom North 68 degrees West 21 chains and 50  
links, (10) North 4 degrees 15 minutes West 30 chains and 46  
links to the middle of the aforesaid Hohokus brook, (11)  
along said brook Northwesterly 105 chains and 70 links to  
lands of Jacob Bartholf, (12) along lands of said Bartholf  
South 74 degrees East 2 chains, (13) along lands of said  
Bartholf and lands of John W. May, South 51 degrees East 8  
chains to the middle of the public road leading to Ramsey,  
(14) South 51 degrees East along lands of John May 15 chains  
and 16 links, (15) along the same North 27 degrees 30 min-  
utes East 13 chains and 63 links, (16) South 54 degrees East  
1 chain and 13 links, (17) North 37 degrees 30 minutes East  
3 chains and 68 links, (18) South 50 degrees East 6 chains  
and 38 links, (19) North 32 degrees 30 minutes East 16 chains  
to a Button Ball tree standing on the East side of the New  
York Lake Erie and Western Railroad and in the Southerly line  
of lands of the heirs of Rhines Van Riper, dec'd; (20) along  
lands of the said heirs South 50 degrees East 5 chains,  
(21) North 50 degrees 30 minutes East 11 chains and 19 links  
(22) North 40 degrees East 4 chains and 11 links, (23) South  
33 degrees 15 minutes East 4 chains and 40 links to the North  
east corner of lands of the said heirs of Rhines Van Riper,

deceased, it being on the West bank of the Ramsey brook, (24) along said brook North 36 degrees East 4 chains and 25 links, (25) North 44 degrees 15 minutes East 6 chains and 22 links to lands of John H. Shuart, (26) along the south bounds of said Shuart South 57 degrees 30 minutes East 9 chains and 92 links to the middle of the Public Road known as the Franklin Turnpike, (27) along the south bounds of John Wilson South 54 degrees 15 minutes East 8 chains and 53 links, (28) North 35 degrees East 10 chains and 70 links, (29) South 53 degrees 30 minutes East 9 chains and 72 links, to the middle of the Public Road leading to Tallmans, (30) along the South bounds of the Linkrum Estate and others South 53 degrees 30 minutes East 51 chains to the middle of a public road, (31) through the middle of said Road South 10 degrees 15 minutes West 51 chains and 59 links to the middle of the public road leading from Saddle River, (32) South 10 degrees 15 minutes West 9 chains to a small brook, (33) South 10 degrees 15 minutes West along said small brook 15 chains and 64 links, to the beginning of the brook herein first mentioned, (34) along the said first mentioned brook southwesterly 60 chains and 11 links to the place of beginning. Containing about 3 5/8 square miles.

N O W T H E R E F O R E, I, JAMES M. VAN VALEN,  
President Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Bergen, aforesaid, having examined said petition and the affidavits annexed by which it appears to my satisfaction that all the requirements of said act have been complied with, do hereby order that a special election be held, in conformity with the provisions of said act and the supplements thereto, at Archer Hall, Allendale, in the township of Orvil, being a

convenient place within said proposed Borough, on the eighth day of November, eighteen hundred and ninety four, to the end that the persons qualified to vote at such election may vote for or against the incorporation of a Borough within the said prescribed territory to be known as "The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale," in order that it may be decided by the votes of said electors whether the Borough shall be formed, and I do hereby appoint Alfred E. Ivers Clerk of said Election and William H. Mallinson and Joseph H. Ware inspectors thereof, said person being legal voters and freeholders within the limits of said proposed Borough.
