

FIRST FAMILIES OF ALLENDALE

Included in this section are many of the families residing in Allendale (or of the area that would later become Allendale) before 1920. The date 1920 was chosen as a cutoff date for two reasons: (1) 1920 is the year of the most recent Federal Census publicly available at this writing (there is a 70-year privacy delay in releasing Federal Census records for public use); and (2) as Allendale's population grew, listing of families after 1920 would have made this section so large that it would have been prohibitively expensive to print. Although the cutoff date of 1920 is generally used, some exceptions have been made in order to include biographical information, where known, of Allendale's Mayors, other important contributors to Allendale's civic, business, and social growth, and Allendale residents who gained local or national fame. Eliminated due to lack of space are most families who are thought to have lived in Allendale for only a brief period of time. Also eliminated from this section are individuals and families for whom no additional information is known other than what appears in the narrative text of this book.

Much of the information and data in the following mini-biographies of Allendale residents and families came from newspaper accounts, obituaries, and Federal and State Census records. The family groups listed have been compiled using various sources, but not systematically or genealogically researched, and are in some cases incomplete. In any family group there may be additional children, marriages, and biographical information which is unknown at this writing.

A word about census records: the information collected by the enumerator of each census was only as reliable as its source, and does not carry the weight of proof. The census taker went door-to-door and queried residents with a predetermined list of questions, and recorded the answers. The recorded answers to his questions may or may not have been true — especially when it came to dates and ages. Some may have been honest mistakes, as when one person answered for the entire family and may have been confused, or guessed, about dates concerning a family member who may have been temporarily absent at the time of the enumerator's call. Others are obviously "little white lies" and it's amusing to

watch, as you scan from decade to decade, how some people deducted a few years from their ages as the years went by. In addition, all of the records were handwritten, and today's researcher blesses the enumerator with clear, legible handwriting (some records are virtually indecipherable because of poor penmanship; others are almost legible, but require the reader to interpret and guess in some cases).

Newspaper accounts are not always correct, either, and names are sometimes found misspelled or confused, but for contemporary events, they are helpful for dating an occurrence. The facts may or may not be garbled, the names may or may not be misspelled or reported incorrectly, but because it is a contemporary reporting, at least the date can be assumed as likely to be accurate. Early newspapers — county and local papers started reporting extensive local items in the mid-1850s — tended to be chatty (local items and briefs into the 1940s included visits and visitors, illnesses from simple colds to fatal inflictions, social events from card parties and fishing trips to balls and concerts, and other such gossip items along with weddings, deaths, and births).

The family groupings are arranged alphabetically (and within alphabetical arrangement, then chronologically) and are self-explanatory. Middle initials (because so many are uncertain) have been ignored in sorting; very similar surnames (for instance Winter and Winters) have been grouped together for sorting.

Underlined names indicate either that the individual was best known by a particular name (perhaps, for instance, known by a middle name instead of a first name), or that a particular (perhaps unusual) spelling or name is as found, and not a typographical error.

Abbreviations frequently used are b. = born; bp. = baptized; d. = died; m. = married; d.y. = died young.

Some locations whose names have changed are:

Acquackanonk = now Passaic, NJ;

Brabent = Youngs Road area of Ramsey-Mahwah (Fardale);

New Prospect = now Waldwick;

Ponds = now Oakland area;

Schraalenburgh = now Bergenfield area.

Sources follow each family grouping. "P.A.W.

Files" indicates material from my own personal collection and includes various types of information from brief newspaper items to interviews and letters.

Many families and much information (including, for instance, most real estate transactions) have been deleted from this section in the interest of conserving space and keeping printing costs down. It is my intention to place on file at the Allendale Public Library a more complete account, which will also include some families moving to and living in Allendale after 1920.

They lived on Franklin Tpk., Allendale, near the Waldwick border, possibly in the house at 70 Franklin Turnpike, Allendale. He was probably the Aaron C. Ackerman who signed a Jan 1811 Franklin Twp. Road Return petition (for vacation of "The Shunpike"). In June 1861 a dozen pewter plates were ploughed up on his farm; it was reported that he had been told years before by a Mr. Folly that they had been buried there during the Revolutionary War (to prevent their being taken to be made into ammunition) by someone who left to serve in the war and who never returned.

The family lived at 116 West Crescent Avenue, Allendale. The house was destroyed by fire in January 1857 and was rebuilt. Abraham G. Ackerman was a farmer and ran a general store in Allendale about 1870, which business was later run by his son, Richard V. Ackerman. According to Tobey, in *The Ackerman Family*, Abraham and Catherine are listed in Albany Land transactions for 1864. The same source says descendants remember Abraham as being from NYC.

They lived at 475 Franklin Turnpike, Allendale in the house which had belonged to John Fell during the Revolution. When the route of the Paterdson & Ramapo Railroad was planned in the 1840s, Joseph Warner Allen, the railroad's surveyor, engineer, and construction supervisor, lived with this family. Allendale was later named in Allen's honor.

John G. Ackerman was a merchant. They were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, Hohokus Twp. Living with them was Dubois Hasbrouck, 25, doctor, who probably lived in an old stone house on their property (torn down c. 1890s). John G. Ackerman's daughter, Jane, is said to have started a Sunday School in Allendale which became the Episcopal Church. John G. Ackerman's will dated 26 Feb 1878, probated 21 Dec 1885, is recorded in Bergen County (P:376).

They lived in Allendale on Park Avenue, then Allendale Avenue, and finally at 48 Elm Street. John H. Ackerman took over the general/grocery store in Allendale which had been run by his father, and eventually converted the business to the sale of coal and fuel oil. He later ran the business with his son Richard, and had offices in Ramsey and Allendale. He was an Allendale Borough Councilman, Borough Collector, and a charter member of the Allendale Fire Department in 1910. He was a charter vice president of the First National Bank of Allendale, a director of the Bank, and one of its organizers. He was also a director of the Allendale Building and Loan Association.

Joseph Warner Allen, surveyor of the route of the Paterson & Ramapo Railroad through Allendale, stayed with the family of John G. Ackerman on Franklin Turnpike in Allendale about 1846, while surveying in this area. When the station was established, the stop was named "Allendale" in his honor.

He was a civil engineer. He began as a rodman during the construction of the old Delaware Division Canal and was engaged on the construction of the Camden and Amboy Railway at Bordentown. He was employed on the building of the Grand Gulf and Port Gibson Railroad in Mississippi and the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad in Virginia. After working for the Paterson and Ramapo Railroad, he was chief engineer of the Hoboken Land and Improvement Co., the Dundee Water Power and Land Co., and various railroad enterprises.

He was deputy quartermaster-general of New Jersey, and organized and equipped the first eight regiments of three years' volunteers for the Civil War. He was a colonel of the 9th New Jersey volunteers, and joined the Burnside expedition in North Carolina. He drowned off Cape Hatteras January 15, 1862 while on the Burnside Expedition. He was held in such high esteem by his fellow officers and men, that the survivors, two years later, in 1864, erected over his grave in Bordentown, a 15'6" marble memorial. It is inscribed as follows: "Joseph W. Allen, Colonel, Ninth Regiment, New Jersey Volunteers, drowned at Hatteras, North Carolina, January fifteenth, 1862, in the fifty-first year of his age." "This monument is erected by the officers and men of the Ninth Regiment, New Jersey Volunteers, as a tribute of grateful respect to the memory of their first commander, who, while faithfully serving his country in the darkest hour of her peril, even to the sacrifice of his life, endeared himself to the hearts of his whole command."

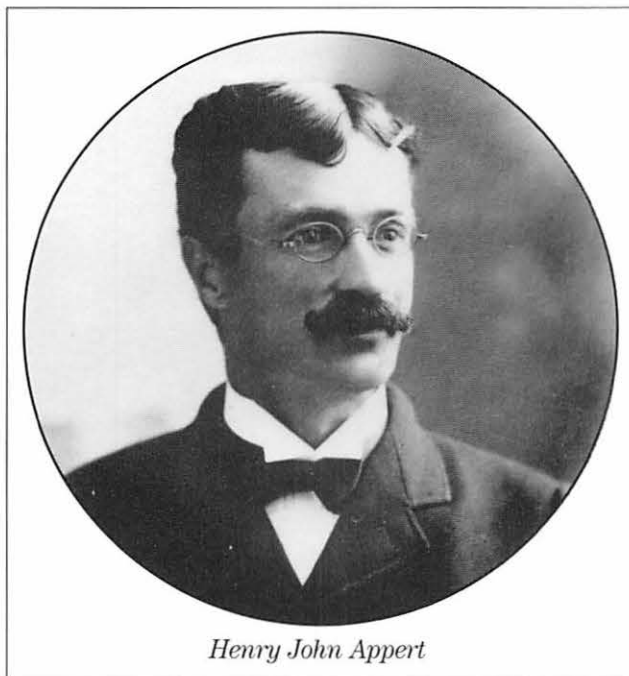

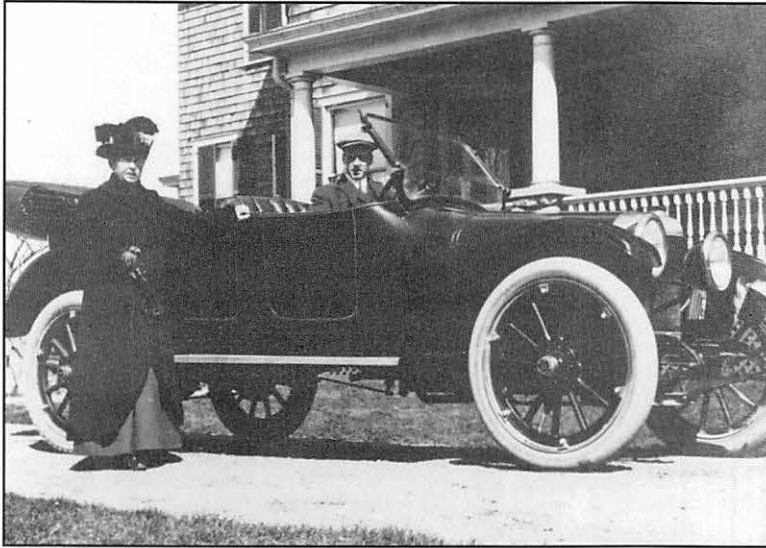

He purchased land in Allendale in 1892 and began clearing the overgrown marshland (the former Wolf Swamp) and growing onions and later, celery and lettuce, on what would become the Allendale Produce Gardens, better known locally as "the celery farm." In 1893 he raised 2,400 bushels of onions. He retired about 1915 and turned the business over to his son, Arthur A. Appert.

Henry J. Appert was on the Allendale Board of Education in 1900, and was appointed Allendale's Surveyor of Highways in May 1895. He was an Allendale Borough Councilman and a director of the First National Bank and Trust Co. of Ramsey.

Ella B. Finn Appert immigrated in 1875 and was naturalized in 1884.

The Appert home and an onion storehouse on Cottage Place was totally destroyed by fire in December 1896, in which the family lost nearly all of their belongings. The storehouse full of 900 barrels of

onions smouldered for several days, and it was said that the smell of burning onions lingered for weeks after the fire. The family moved into a house on East Allendale Avenue, and later, about summer 1908, moved to a new house at 1 Cottage Place. O. H. P. Archer bought a summer home at Allendale in 1868. He worked for the Erie Railroad beginning about 1917. He was a brakeman by 1933, a trainman, and was a conductor for the Erie in 1942. He was vice-president of the Allendale Ambulance Corps in October 1941 and president of the Allendale Fire Department in 1942. He was a member of the New Jersey State First Aid Council, and a first Aid instructor, certified by the Red Cross. He was appointed as an Allendale Marshall in March 1943. He was Allendale's Chief Marshall in 1946 and 1947. He was very popular in Allendale and served in many civic capacities. He was the favorite Santa Claus at the parties given annually at the Fire House for the children of the borough. On August 9, 1942 he was praised by the Erie and lauded by doctors when he applied first aid in Port Jervis, NY to Howard W. Rasher, 18, whose legs were severed when he attempted to board a moving train and slipped beneath its wheels. In October 1942 he was awarded a certificate of merit from the American National Red Cross for the heroic act.
