They lived on a farm in Allendale on the site of today's Allendale A&P shopping center. He was a farmer.

He was enumerated in the 1840 Federal Census for Franklin Township (listed between Isaac M. Everson and Abraham I. Storms). At the time of the 1865 State Census, living with them was Adelia Lydecker. In the 1870 Federal Census for Hohokus Township, Delia Lydecker, age 9 (prob. their granddaughter) was living with John A. and Dolly Garrison. At the time of the 1900 Federal Census, Dolly Garrison, farmer, was listed as head of the household. Living with her were Charles Hopper, b. Mar 1860 NY, a day laborer; his wife of 33 years, Margaret R. Hopper, b. Oct 1860 NY; mother of 4 children, 1 then living; and their son David R. Hopper, b. May 1898 NJ.

On 16 Mar 1868 John A. Garrison and Dolly his wife conveyed to Herman Talman and Marie, his wife, and Harvey Sherwood and Charity M., his wife, for \$6,000. a tract of 34 acres located on both sides of what is today Park Avenue (earlier called Allendale Avenue) from First Street to what is now New Street. *children of John A. They lived at 42 Park Avenue, Allendale. He was born in Castle Grande, Italy, about 80 miles north-

west of Naples. He came to America in 1886 and returned to Italy in 1888, where he served three years in the Italian army as a sharpshooter. At the end of his service he married and had a daughter in Italy. The family later returned to America (he in 1890 and she in 1899 with daughter Rose) and he lived in Newark, Orange, and Paterson before coming to Allendale in 1898, where he opened a shop next to Hop Yeomans' butcher shop. The Ramsey Journal reported, on 15 April 1898 that "Wally Gasparini has opened a boot and shoe repair shop near the depot."

In August 1904 he was the proprietor of the Allendale Shoe Store, selling and repairing shoes. He was a charter member of the Allendale Fire Association in 1910. He was listed in the 1900 Federal Census and the 1905 State Census as a shoemaker. In the 1910 Federal Census he is listed as a blinds & screen carpenter; she is listed as a clerk in a shoe store. In 1920 he is listed as a shoe dealer with his own shop (on Park Avenue).

In January 1920 he and his first wife lived in a house they owned on Brookside Avenue. He lived at 38 Powell Road, Allendale in March 1940. They moved to 323 Brookside Avenue (to a house built in 1919) in March 1940. He lived in Allendale 57 years before moving to Suffern, NY, where he was a resident at 23 Bon Aire Circle at the time of his death in June 1977. He died aboard the S. S. Kungsholm while it was headed for England.

In January 1920 he was a bank clerk. He was later assistant vice president in the stock transfer division of the Morgan Guaranty Trust Co. in NYC, retiring in 1960. He was an army veteran of World War I and was an award-winning gardener.

Anne Geismar, and her daughter Margaret, of Park Avenue, Allendale, moved in January 1938 to Jersey City, NJ.

Martha Veyner Geismar was a teacher in the Allendale School. She was elected a trustee of the Allendale Library Association 4 Feb 1946, and was elected vice-president of the Association 30 July 1952.

In January 1920 he was a clerk in a railroad company office.

She ran a lunch stand ("The Red Rooster") on the corner of Brookside Avenue and West Crescent

Avenue in June 1927 (this may have been a summer-time business). She ran a nursery kindergarten beginning October 1927. In 1929 she was advertising an interior decoration business.

He lived at 200 Hillside Avenue. In the spring and summer of 1902 workmen were renovating and decorating the house he bought on Hillside Avenue. In January 1920 he was 78, a widower, living in a house he owned on Hillside Avenue.

He immigrated in 1852, and was naturalized in 1868. He was a confectioner in New York City, running one of the largest wholesale confectioneries in the east (said to have specialized in chocolate-covered cherries). He was an honorary member of the Allendale Fire Association. Living with him in January 1920 were his sister, Sophie Herbaut, 80, a widow, b. France, immigrated 1852 and naturalized in 1865. Also living with them were servants Anna O'Donnell, 45, single, b. NJ, a cook; Rosa Schwendimanni, 28, single, b. Switzerland, immigrated 1915, an alien, a waitress; and Hugh Hopper, 59,

widower, b. Ireland, immigrated 1889, naturalized 1919, a hired man. His chauffeur, Albert Johnson, and his family lived in the next listed house in the census.

Harry I. Hand lived in a house behind the delicatessen in the business section of Allendale; later he bought a lot on West Orchard Street from the Powell estate (in 1902) and by July 1904, his new house was nearing completion. He was employed by the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company for 43 years, and was claims manager at the time of his retirement. He was the drill captain of the Bergen Guards. He was a borough clerk of Allendale and president of the Board of education of Allendale at the time of his death. After his death, Mrs. Hand, an invalid, moved to 158 Ridgewood Ave., Ridgewood, NJ.
