He was Mayor of Allendale in 1925 and 1926. He was a charter member of the Allendale Fire Association and was president of the Allendale Fire Department in 1915. He was a charter member of the Allendale Board of Trade. He was president of the Allendale Board of Education and a member of the Allendale Borough Council. In June 1905 they lived in a house they rented on or near Franklin Turnpike and East Allendale Avenue. They lived on West Crescent Avenue, Allendale by January 1920 in a house they owned. As early as Apr 1918 there was a smaller cottage on his property; they were moving from their cottage to their big house, "which has recently undergone many beautiful interior decorations." In Sep 1931 he was building a four room and bath bungalow on his property, for his own occupancy. Beginning about 1923 they wintered in Florida. In 1940 the house at 852 West Crescent Avenue was owned by "Lawrence" (perhaps the estate).

In June 1905 he was a bookkeeper. He was an accountant and a dry goods manufacturer's superintendent. In 1920 he was a manager in a linen factory. He was a director of the Orvil Co-operative Building & Loan Association in 1920.

By Sep 1894 he had bought three acres of land from A. E. Ivers. 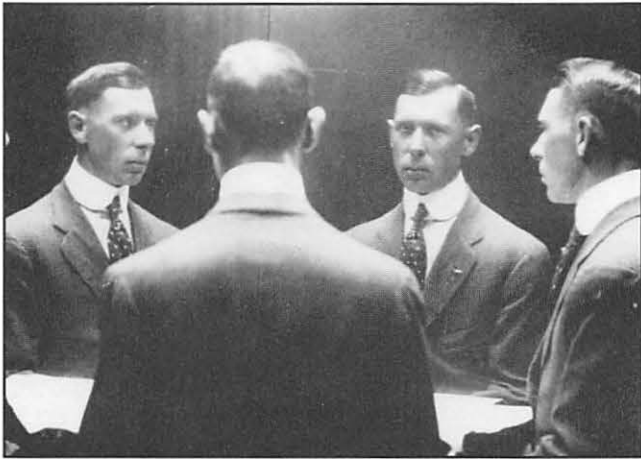

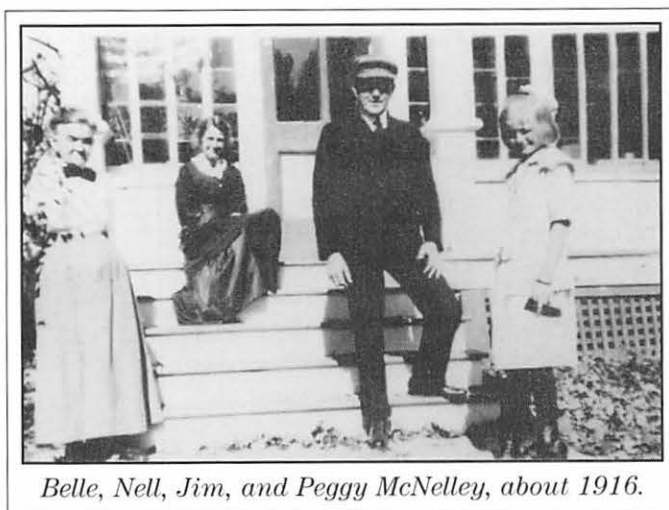
