In 1940 they owned the house on Boroline Road that had been built in 1932. He lived at 132 East Allendale Avenue, Allendale at the time of his death in August 1965.

He served in World War II and was vice-president and director of Sterco Industries of New York. He was founder and president of the Aquarium Supply

Company at Allendale, in business by 1965.

He was a well-known baseball figure. During the 1940s and early 1950s, he was one of the best known semipro baseball managers in North Jersey. While still in his teens he organized his first baseball team, the Allendale Blue Sox. Later he formed the Allendale B.B.C., which played in the Bergen County Baseball League. After World War II, he organized several teams, the first of which was the Allendale Legion, another entry in the B.C.B.L. Other teams with which he was connected during the late 1940s and early 1950s were the Paterson Silk Sox, East Orange B.B.C., Madison Colonels, and the Bushwicks. It was during this period that he made headlines by bringing to the area such players as Harvey Haddix and Whitey Ford, soon to become major league standouts. "Vic loved baseball," said his brother Angelo, "He refused to admit that semipro baseball was a dying sport in those days, and he often spent his entire paycheck to pay his players and to bring top talent to Bergen County."

About 1876 James Alfred Ackerman sold part of his farm and his dwelling on Franklin Turnpike, Allendale, to W. P. Shearman for \$10,500. In August 1877 Shearman was renovating the house and putting up an addition to it. This house stood on approximately the site of today's Allendale Nursery. The original house (after being renovated again) burned in 1925, and in 1974 the chimneys from the house were still standing.

William Pitt Shearman was an examiner of accounts in the United States Treasury for 17 years, aided in the reorganization of the Internal Revenue Bureau, and was at one time the general supervisor of the Quartermaster's Account in Washington. He was Treasurer of the Erie Railroad about 1876. In 1879 he was appointed a Commissioner of Accounts by Mayor Cooper of New York City.

His carriage and matched horses Allen and Dale, were a frequent sight in Allendale and it was said that they "could not be matched for beauty in the county."

At the time of the 1880 Federal Census, he is listed as a commissioner, living in Allendale, with his three children (Robert, Mary, and Harry), but no wife is listed. Living with him were his sisters Helen and Maria.

William P. Shearman (spelled Sherman in this Census) was listed in the 1885 New Jersey State Census, living in Hohokus Township. Living with him were Helen Shearman, Maria Shearman, Hoban Shearman, Mary Shearman, and Harry Shearman.

Mary W. Shearman sold the Ackerman-Shearman house about or before 1912 to Herbert Tremaine.

Boarding with them in June 1905 were William K. Walton, 36, and Florence G. Walton, 28. Boarding with them at the time of the 1910 Federal Census were William K. Walton, 40, and Floral G., 32, his wife.

In January 1920 he was living on East Allendale Avenue in a house he owned, with his daughter

Carrie. Living with them were boarders: Inez Hill, 21, single, b. NY, a teacher in a grammar school; Dorothy Winchester, 20, single, b. NY, a teacher in a grammar school; Mary Norris, 19, single, b. NJ, a teacher in a grammar school; and George Parigot, 48, single, b. Brazil, immigrated 1885, naturalized 1889, a manager with a steel corporation.

• **Carrie Switzer**, b. about 1863 NJ; d. June 1947 Saylorburg, PA; buried Lutheran Cemetery, Saddle River. She never married. She was the organist for the Archer Memorial Methodist Church until 1912. She ran the Allendale School of Music at "Switzer Manor," the Switzer home on East Allendale Avenue in Allendale, in 1915. She advertised a teaching capacity of 200 day pupils (!) and accommodations for a limited number of resident pupils.

• **Walter E. Switzer**, b. about 1859; d. March 1916 Ridgewood, NJ; buried Valleau Cemetery, Ridgewood, NJ; m. (1) **Anna Augusta Pell**, dau. of David Ackerman Pell & Catherine Ann Ackerman (she was b. 4 Dec 1858, d. 9 June 1898 aged 39 yrs); he m. (2) -?-, who survived him. He was a real estate agent. According to the Martha Ann Zabriskie diary, at the time of their m. he was of Scotland Hill, Spring Valley, NY; she was from Saddle River. The Kakiat m. record says he was of Scotland and she was of Saddle River; wits. to the m. were Gabriel Hill of Scotland and John J. Debaun of Saddle River.

He developed, with Harvey Sherwood, abt. 1870 in Allendale, 34 acres along Park Avenue; and also built a hotel at Allendale which was run by his son-in-law, James A. DeBaun. Probably the financially hard times of the 1870s kept the development from reaching its full potential.

About October 1885 John D. Naugle bought the hotel at Allendale which had been built by Herman Tallman.

He came to Allendale about 1884. In 1890 plans were being drawn up for his new house, to be built by Van Blarcom. In 1905 he sold his house. They lived on Myrtle Avenue at the time of the 1910 Federal Census (and in 1920, in a house they owned). They lived at 106 Powell Road at the time of her death in 1933. William C. Talman owned the house at 106 Powell Road in 1940.

She lived at Rutherford at the time of their marriage.

He was listed in the 1900 Federal Census as a superintendent in a drug house. Living with them at the time of the 1900 Federal Census was his mother, Emma L. Talman, b. Sep 1835 NY, widow, mother of 4 children, 2 then living. In June 1905 they were living in a rented house on Franklin Turnpike (near Ilsley), and his mother, Emma, was living with them.

He was president of the Allendale Board of Education, charter vice-president of the Allendale Fire Association in 1910; secretary of the Orvil Building & Loan Association (elected April 1898).

She was an Allendale Borough Councilwoman, a county committeewoman, president of the Allendale Woman's Club, and was on the Allendale Library Board. She was an acting librarian in Nov 1921, was secretary of the Allendale Library Association, and signed the certificate of incorporation of the Library in 1923.
