

In January 1920 Cornelia Tamburello, 50, widow, was listed as head of the household, living in a house she owned on Franklin Turnpike, near the Cockroft house. Living with her in January 1920 were Kathryn Haulenbeck, 23, married, housekeeper; Marian C. Jiroux, 4 and 6/12, boarder; Lillian Jiroux, 1 and 3/12, boarder; and James Haulenbeck, 23, a chauffeur for a grocery store.

In December 1930 she lived on Franklin Turnpike, but had left to spend the winter months in New York City.

He graduated from Columbia University in 1888 with a degree in civil engineering. He later specialized in utilities. He was commissioned a Lieutenant (J.G.) in the Naval Reserve after graduation from Columbia. He was employed first by the Westinghouse, Church, Kerr & Co. of NYC and later worked for W. F. Barstow Co. of New York.

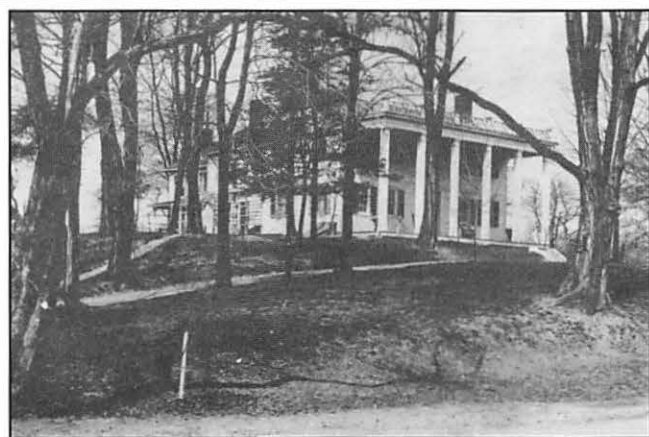
Joseph B. Taylor's grandfather, William Taylor (b. 1812 Oldham, England), founded the Columbia Iron

Works (later William Taylor & Sons) in Brooklyn, suppliers for the iron used for the Brooklyn Bridge. His other grandfather, Edward Godfrey Wisdom Greenwood was b. 1800 Halifax, Nova Scotia, and was in the shipping business and was city treasurer of Halifax.

In later life she lived in New York City and wrote prodigiously, mainly stories and poems for children, including "Whichitee, Which Way? and Other Stories" and "When Dragons Yawn and Other Poems."
- **Ruth Greenwood Taylor**, b. 3 Nov 1898 Brooklyn, NY; d. 1977; m. **Whiting Anthony**. She graduated from the Allendale School in 1912.
- **William Robinson Taylor**, b. 2 May 1906 Brooklyn, NY; m. **Marion R. Gewin**. He lived on Franklin Turnpike from 1912-1931 and also from 1942-1950. In 1993 he lives at Old Lyme, CT. He was an investment counselor.
- **Margaret B. Taylor**, b. about 1908 NY; m. April 1933 Plaza Hotel, NYC, **Robert Eugene Kohler**, son of former Gov. & Mrs. Walter Kohler, of Kohler, WI. He was associated in business with his father, Walter J. Kohler, manufacturers of the Kohler bathroom fixtures and plumbing supplies. She graduated from Smith College, and he graduated from Yale.
- **Arnold Pitcher Taylor**, b. about 1912 NJ; m. Dec 1941 Little Church Around the Corner, NYC, **Lois Grant**. He graduated from Princeton University and at the time of his marriage was with the Wright Aeronautical Corporation in Paterson, NJ.

He is likely the Peter Thybow listed in the 1779 Franklin Township Rateables (listed just after Samuel Bush and just before Charles Degray) with 100 acres of land, 9 horses or cattle, 1 slave. In the

December 1780 Franklin Township Rateables, Peter Debow (listed just after Mary Knaght and just before Hannah Bush) is listed with 60 acres improved land, 40 acres unimproved land, 2 horses, 3 horned cattle, 2 hogs.

The inventory of his estate is the earliest estate inventory on file at Hackensack (A: 1). It was made 2 Mar 1804 by Susannah Tebow, his widow and executrix, John Van Blarcom and Abraham Quackenbush, administrators of the will, and Abraham Westervelt and Henry A. Hopper, appraisers. The inventory is lengthy and represents the estate of a very well-to-do farmer of the time. It lists debtors owing amounts to the estate, 7 slaves, various household items and farm goods.

It was probably this Peter Tebow who on 23 Mar 1790 applied to the Sheriff of Bergen County to recover a debt of £25, 7 s, 7p plus interest and costs of his suit, owed him by William Earnest Baron Van Rottenburgh. On 4 Mar 1791 Peter Tebow applied to the Sheriff of Bergen County to recover a debt of £100 plus interest and costs of his suit, owed him by John Van Allen and Peter I. Van Allen.

A George R. Thomas, possibly this one, was living with Charles H. and Agnes E. Weeks in Allendale at the time of the 1895 State Census.

He was a charter member of the Allendale Fire Association in 1910. He was a house and sign painter. He was killed in Dec 1915 by a train accident at the Erie crossing in Allendale. His body was apparently dismembered by the train passing over it and parts of his body were strewn along the tracks. At the time, it was suspected that he had been robbed, killed, and his body left on the tracks to cover up the crime.

He is listed in the 1900 Federal Census (probably living on Hillside Avenue) as a housepainter. Living with them in 1900 was Margaret Storms, age 52 (b. Dec 1841), widow, listed as his mother. She was also living with them at the time of the 1905 State Census, and the 1910 Federal Census.

He served on the Allendale Borough Council. He was Mayor of Allendale 1927-1930. He was elected a trustee of the Allendale Library Association 10 Dec 1934. He served as a member of the House of Representatives of the U.S. Congress 1937-1949. He later was a newspaper publisher and in the real estate business.

They lived in the Thurston homestead on East Saddle River Road, Saddle River, until they moved to Allendale. They lived at 309 Franklin Turnpike, Allendale (built for them about 1922).

Henry N. Thurston ran the Allendale Garage, on Franklin Turnpike at Allendale across from Archer Hall by 1915, and opened a second business in Hackensack about March 1916. In 1920 he had a new cobblestone Arts and Crafts style building erected further south along the Franklin Turnpike in Allendale, at 317 Franklin Turnpike. Here he ran H.N. Thurston's Allendale Sales and Service (later H. N. Thurston & Sons, Inc.), selling and servicing automobiles (and later farm equipment). In 1950 the business was a Chrysler-Plymouth dealership. He was a charter director of the First National Bank of Allendale in 1925.

They lived on Franklin Turnpike. They sold their home on Franklin Turnpike about July 1927 to B. M. McLeod, proprietor of the Allendale Department Store.

He was a reporter on *The Newark Evening News*, eventually becoming its managing editor. He was publicity director for the Central Railroad of New Jersey and edited the company's official publication. He was vice-president and manager of *The Scranton (PA) Daily Tribune*. He was managing editor of "The Pictorial Review." He was an associate editor of *The Delineator* and editor of *The Designer*. He organized the publicity department of the American Child Health Association and was associate secretary and director of publicity for the American Public Health Association.

He was a member of the Allendale School Board in 1914. In March 1915 he was president of the newly formed Borough Dramatic Company, later the Allendale Players. He was elected president of the

Allendale Library Association 22 April 1919, and of the newly incorporated Allendale Library Association in 1923. In 1922 he was Allendale's Recorder, and was sworn in as a Bergen County Justice of the Peace. He worked for the local Red Cross chapter, was a founder of the Allendale Board of Trade, and formed the Patriotic League (Home Defense Committee) in Allendale during World War I.

John Van Blarcom was a Private in the Revolution. His land was in the Allendale-Wyckoff vicinity.

He was listed in the 1779 Franklin Township Rateables (listed just after John Michler and just before John J. Ackerson) with 100 acres of land, 5 horses or cattle, and one slave. In the Dec 1780 Franklin Township Rateables (listed just after Samuel Forgesson and just before Mary Knaght), he had 50 acres improved land, 50 acres unimproved land, 3 horses, 3 horned cattle, and 2 hogs.

His will, dated 23 May 1827, established a right-of-way roadway known as "Van Blarcom's Lane" leading from what is now Brookside Avenue to Van Blarcom property partly in Wyckoff and partly in Allendale. The Allendale portion of the property is now encompassed by Butternut and Beechwood Roads off Schuyler Road in Allendale. He inherited property from his father, who mentioned in his will "the improvement" where he then dwelled, "at the Cranberry Vley."

Smith, who later published his own periodical, *The Landscape*, from his home in Saddle River).
