



Albert A. L. Zabriskie was elected Commissioner of Appeals at Allendale Borough's first election held 4 Dec 1894. He was and Allendale Borough Councilman and was Mayor of Allendale 1921, 1922, 1923 & 1924.

Albert A. L. Zabriskie was the first and only President of the 1887 Village Improvement Association. He was a member of the Allendale Christmas Tree Association in 1917. He signed the certificate of incorporation for the Allendale Library in 1923. He was Vice president of the Orvil Co-operative Building & Loan Association in March 1889. He was president of the Allendale Board of Education.

He graduated from the Allendale School and Waters Seminary in Paterson, and then began a 30 year period of commuting to NYC where he worked for Calhoun-Robbins, a wholesale dry goods firm. In 1895 he ran a delicatessen and dairy business in Paterson. He started his own business, the Cylinder Manufacturing Co. in Hawthorne (he was vice president in January 1920), from which he retired about 1939. He was a charter member of the Ridgewood Unitarian Church.

Harriet Reed Pulling Zabriskie was one of the founders of the Ladies' Village Improvement Association (later the Community Club, and still later the Allendale Womans Club).
